<u>Progression in History at Radford Semele C of E Primary School</u>

Early Years:

In our Reception class, the children at Radford Semele begin building the foundations of their history knowledge through the strand 'Understanding the World: Past and Present'. When children start at Radford Semele, they begin reflecting on themselves, their own life story and how they have changed. Through a range of picture books and non-fiction texts, children are encouraged to identify similarities and differences between the past and present and order events chronologically. In the spring term, the children explore more about 'what grown ups do all day' and discuss the lives of people around them.

Understanding the World: Past and Present

Children at the expected level of development will:

- Talk about the lives of people around them and their roles in society.
- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.
- Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.
